Posoh James Pete WIEA,

I am writing to you in regard to an upcoming American Indian & Alaskan Native Youth Summit that 11 Menominee high-school-age students will be taking in May. This innovative educational program is run by the Close Up Foundation, the nation's leading non-profit, non-partisan civic education organization. While on the program, we will participate in a variety of hands-on activities such as small group workshops, seminars with Washington DC journalists, lobbyists, and embassy officials, and meetings with members of Congress and their staff. Furthermore, students will learn from and debate with their peers from across the country, exposing them to differing attitudes and perspectives. We will also be spending 2 days in New York City exploring significant monuments pertaining to the federal government. <a href="mailto:American Indian & Alaskan Native Youth Summit">American Indian & Alaskan Native Youth Summit</a>

The students attending are: Ali Davenport, Houston Hawpetoss, Francis Dodge, Miklo Guzman, Colt Denny, Barron Waupoose, Addison Uttecht, Desiree Waupoose, Jalena Guzman, Layla Wescott-Knoll, and Kaylee White. They are 10th and 12th graders who attend Menominee Indian High School. The program cost per student is \$2737.00 and is all-inclusive of: travel expenses, academic workshops, meals, lodging, and truly, the experience of a lifetime!

#### Total trip cost is:

\$30,107.00 (\$2737.00 per student)

#### Expenses covered are:

\$5,500.00 deposits paid (\$500.00 per student)
+\$9,050.00 cash on hand (raised through fundraising and other means already)
\$14,550.00 Total

#### Amount still needed:

\$15,557.00

This is a tremendous opportunity to positively affect the lives of a large group of Menominee youth. My personal belief is that our youth need to see and experience the larger world beyond the reservation in order to fully appreciate what we have here and to understand our place in this world.

The trip will take place Sunday, April 30, 2023 through Sunday, May 7, 2023. Our final payment deadline is February 23, 2023.

While I have applied to a \$5000.00 grant from Walmart, the cost students still need is significant. The parents have organized a number of fundraisers in the effort to try and reach this goal. Please note that the students also will need money for snacks and souvenirs, so the dollar amount listed above is the minimum that they need to fundraise. We are currently engaged in a number of fundraising ventures: Raffles, working Concession Stands for HS sporting events, a Community Funding Panel application was submitted, a t-shirt fundraiser and we are holding a soup sale on February 17, 2023.

We are seeking support from your organization in the form of a monetary donation. If your organization would be able to donate \$500.00, that will go a long way toward helping us reach our goal.
