2022 PRESIDENT'S LOG

NOVEMBER~WIEA Board meeting held at the Stockbridge-Munsee Tribal Headquarters on November 18th. Really appreciate the hospitality and attendance, both in-person, and via Zoom.

After a WIEA Board meeting, there is following on a number of issues that I, as the President does, including the following:

~Request to Wisconsin Arts Board on the potential funding of the Ancestral Women's Performan and Youth Art Contest for the WIEA 2023 Conference

~Initial contact with the contact persons of the Wisconsin Women's Group in the revision of their Proposal, i.e., offering 4 hotel rooms for 2 evenings, etc.

~Request to LCO-U President Swagger and CEO, Bryan Bainbridge of GLITC on their letter of support for the Mascot initiative

~Initial discussion on the Legislative Breafast with Virginia Nuske willing to provide information from previous efforts. Virginia sent an e-mail to Joseph A. Strohl, State Government Relations, to obtain some potential dates to host the Legislative Breakfast in 2023

~On a personal note, I stayed at the Madison East Double Tree in Madison, November 25th. This is where the 2023 WIEA Conference will be held. I wanted to get a view of the layout, etc., for the various activities that will be held during the Conference

~Based on Meeting Room and the menu selections, developed a draft Revenue and Cost document, relating to the meals, break items, Awards Banquet, including a "draft" Registration Fee. This also included a Registration Form, indicating Membership of those attending

~The Great Lakes Native American Elders Association (GLNAEA) had their quarterly meeting in Lac Du Flambeau on December 7-8th. During this time, not only because I am a member of GLNAEA, I will have an informational table with WIEA and LCO-U materials to share. I am hoping the Elders in attendance will be our advocates for encouraging people to obtain post-secondary education

~**WEATHER PERMITTING** Arrangements to attend a historic signing of an MOU between the Menominee Nation and the Department of Public Instruction on December 15th. Very honored to be asked to participate and witness another historical event in the world of Indian Education

~Discussions with David O'Connor on collaborative efforts between WIEA, DPI, Tribal Governments, Tribal Education Directors
