• Delaney is the daughter of Tom and Deb Boelter. She is the youngest in her family, with 4 older sisters. She grew up in Keshena and is a 2013 graduate of Shawano High School. She was a 3 sport athlete all 4 years of high school, going on to play soccer at UW-Stevens Point. She graduate from UWSP in 4 years, obtaining a bachelor's degree in Healthcare Administration. She eventually decided that nursing was her calling, so she is now pursuing a bachelor's degree at Bellin College in Green Bay. She shared her essay with the WIEA board.

President's Report

- Act 31 celebration: The event has evolved over the last 5 years, and it is a great way for tribal communities to highlight their efforts. Next year's celebration will be held <u>August 19, 2019 in Lac du Flambeau</u>. This will be the 30-year anniversary of Act 31, and the 6th annual celebration. Ashley Maki and team are taking the lead.
- 2019 WIEA Conference: As the West Region couldn't take the lead this year, the Central Region is hosting. The committee was deciding between two locations. Two dates were proposed. The board clarified to the committee chair, Gladys Walker, that the committee doesn't need board approval for anything; they can move forward how they see fit.
- Brandon Thoms and Torchlight Contract: The Torchlight contract expired on July 10th, however, Brandon has continued to provide services to WIEA out of good will. He fulfilled all aspects of the contract and a new contract was proposed and sent out for a poll vote. He has not increased his contract amount since he began providing services during 2015. This contract has a slight increase, as he provides additional services in assisting with the WIEA conference in terms of marketing and technical support and he continues to donate to the annual conference. Under Torchlight's services to increase awareness of WIEA, conference revenues have increased.

 - Monthly outreach: Discussed having monthly features of Tribal Education Directors, WIEA Board,
 NIEA, DPI, etc. Brandon will obtain video of Act 31 celebration keynote speaker and include in WIEA media
- WIEA web host site: There continues to be issues regarding the .org website account with NewTech Solutions, as the previous WIEA President's name is on the account and WIEA does not have any authority over the .org domain. The board is looking to remedy this situation. The board made a motion that Brandon would draft a letter to NewTech, requesting either replacing the authorized name on the account or adding Brian's name. The letter will give the date that Michelle LaRock stepped down and Brian Jackson stepped in to the WIEA President role; including information stating that these are elected positions, along with the minutes/motions that reflect this statement. If they don't honor the request to change the name on the account, we may have to discontinue services with them.

NIEA Update

- Jolene gave an update. The NIEA Bulletin went out, highlighting that the Perkin's Act was signed by the
 President (Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act). Among other things, the
 reauthorization mandates tribal consultations regarding planning, goal-setting, and maintaining of Career and
 Technical Education (CTE) programs.
- Discussed state & tribal elections some individuals don't believe in voting because they think they may be compromising their status. If you want to make change, you need to vote!
- Unseen Tears document: Jolene is doing a workshop at NIEA. She started her research on boarding schools under Sister Stephanie Spence. She continued her work, talking with elders, discovering the undocumented side of boarding schools. She started some writing on this. There is still a lot of healing to do from this era.
- August 11th was the deadline for the NIEA board application. Jolene shared an update on the NIEA awards.
- By-laws will be voting on during the 2019 convention. Regionality is the issue in the forefront. Attendees are strongly encouraged to vote. NIEA needs to continue to strengthen themselves to stand strong in the face of this current administration.
- 2019 marks the 50th anniversary of NIEA. The annual conference will be held in Minnesota.
- The National Native American Boarding School Healing Coalition (NABS) is hosting their first national conference, on October 2-3, 2018 in Carlisle, PA. The theme is *The Spirit Survives: A National Movement Toward Healing*. The deadline to apply to be on the board for NABS is October 15th.

New Business

David O'Connor introduced Mickey Medix from the Necedah School District. David and Mickey are conducting
exploratory work and seeking input regarding a proposed project. They shared that there is an Observance
Calendar across public schools in Wisconsin, celebrating Leif Erikson Day, Abraham Lincoln Day, etc. However,



there is a lack of representation of Wisconsin tribes and people of color in this calendar. The goal is to have this calendar be inclusive of all Wisconsin tribes. To have this done, it would have to be an act of Legislators. The idea is to have 11 separate days that would represent each Wisconsin tribe - and each tribe would have input as to their specific day and the educational materials that would be provided/shared. Many schools are starting to be aware of Act 31, and this would support the language of Act 31. Joe Strohl would be a potential drafter of this proposal; involve organizations such as WASDA (Wisconsin Association of School District Administrators), WIEA, etc.
